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AUMSVILLE PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING - WORK SESSION

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM in the Aumsville City Hall, 595 Main Street, Aumsville, Oregon by Vice chair Russ Snow. Ron Harding presented the planning commission with a power point presentation highlighting the following content.

Planning commission directive: To implement the codes approved by City council. Planning commission role: Serves in an advisory capacity to the city council, Serve as the appeal board for type 1 decisions.

Administrative decisions made at the staff level for

Planning commission role: Serves in a quasi-judicial board type 2 decisions. Appealed to city council.

- 7. Major modifications to approved site plan

Planning commission role: Serves in an quasi- judicial board type 3 decisions. Planning commission hear and recommends to council and council hear to approve.

The local officials failed to follow the correct procedures in making the decision, and the procedural error deprived the Petitioner of a substantial right, The local officials failed to follow the correct procedures in making the decision, and the procedural error deprived the Petitioner of a substantial right. [NOTE: Petitioners´ "substantial rights" are the rights to a reasonable opportunity to prepare and submit their cases and a full and fair hearing, not the right to a particular outcome.] The decision violates a constitutional guarantee, a state law (e.g., statute, statewide planning goal) or a local law (e.g., comprehensive plan policy, zoning ordinance). The land use decision is not supported by "substantial evidence in the whole record;" or If the decision is a limited land use decision, it is not supported by "substantial evidence in the record." ORS 197.828(2) Looser pays the cost of the appeal.

Planning commission role: A Type IV action is a legislative review in which the city considers and enacts or amends laws and policies. Private parties cannot request a Type IV action, except as set forth in Section 15.00 of the development ordinance and Oregon initiative law (ORS 250.305). It must be initiated by city staff, Commission, or Council. Public notices and hearing are provided in

CA Harding also walked planning commission members through Ordinance 354 which governed planning commission authority, structure, and limitations. The planning commission members reviews past decision to determine how they could approach decisions differently in the future.
